# Food for thought


You are invited to Lent lunch and conversation at Heath House, Layer Breton (2 doors down from the Hare and Hounds pub).

# Lent Bible Study 2019

## Kelvedon Churches

Join St Mary Immaculate RC Church, Kelvedon URC & St Mary the Virgin for our Lent groups. There are two groups to choose from, and you can attend either, and/or switch between the two if you can't make a particular session.

**Tuesday mornings at Kelvedon URC, 11 am – 12 noon (starting Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> March)**

**Wednesday evenings at St Mary Immaculate RC Church, 8-9 pm**

We are using the book '**Life in the Psalms – Contemporary Meanings in Ancient Texts**' by **Patrick Woodhouse** (Bloomsbury 2015) ISBN 978-1-4729-2314-1. It is also available as an ePDF (-2316-5) & an ePub (-2315-8)

This was the 2016 Mowbray Lent Book; the author is an Anglican priest and was a Canon of Wells Cathedral for 13 years. It has a detailed and helpful introduction about the nature of the Psalms, and then is split into six chapters, each containing 5 psalms. After the text of each psalm there is a reflection by the author of 2-5 pages.

### **The themes of the 6 chapters are:**

**Week 1 – Pilgrimage      Week 2 – Prayer      Week 3 – Wonder**  
**Week 4 – The Way      Week 5 – Hope**  
**Week 6 (Holy Week) – Suffering**

The leader will focus on 2-3 psalms each week; our last week is Week 5, so this will include a selection of psalms from the last 2 weeks above, as we don't meet in Holy Week.
